

FOREWORD The Allure of Natural Pearls in Fashion

The trade in natural pearls has been a cornerstone of luxury, particularly for countries along the Arabian Gulf. As early as the 7th century, Arab merchants traversed the Indian Ocean, establishing trade networks that brought prized pearls to various ports, including India. By the early 19th century, the Gulf had become the world's leading supplier of natural pearls, with European jewellery houses seeking the exquisite 'oriental' pearls that epitomised opulence.

In Paris, jewellers working in the Art Nouveau style were captivated by the extraordinary shapes of natural pearls, transforming them into breathtaking interpretations of nature. Iconic figures like Coco Chanel embraced the allure of these gems, elevating them to symbols of modern femininity. Chanel famously remarked that "a woman should be two things: classy and fabulous," a sentiment perfectly illustrated by her use of natural pearls in her designs. Notably, she was also the first designer to introduce faux pearls and gemstones into her collections, sparking a trend that remains popular today. Despite this, the intrinsic value of natural pearls-prized for their rarity and unique beauty—has only grown, reaffirming their status as timeless icons of luxury and elegance.

In 1916, one of the chief architects of the Art Deco movement, Pierre Cartier, traded a twostrand oriental pearl necklace with Mae Plant, or Maisie as she was known, for a Neo-Renaissance mansion on Fifth Avenue, which remains New York's House of Cartier to this day. Both the necklace and the mansion were valued at \$1.2 million, a fair exchange at the time.

VANITY CASES 1894-1950

Exquisite Artistry and Craftsmanship

The Vanity Collection at Liang Yi Museum boasts an exquisite selection of artistry and craftsmanship, where the illustrious presence of pearls from the early 20th century commands particular admiration. These exquisite gems epitomise both opulence and social standing.

During this era, pearls were primarily natural, formed through a complex and unpredictable process within oysters. This rarity, combined with the labour-intensive harvesting methods employed by divers, made natural pearls not just precious but emblematic of wealth and sophistication.
